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LESSONS FROM THE MOUNT

Part Two Of A Five-Part Devotional

Matthew 6:25-34 (NIV)

"I tell you, do not worry. Don't worry about your life and what you will eat or drink. And don't worry about your body and what you will wear. Isn't there more to life than eating? Aren't there more important things for the body than clothes? Look at the birds of the air. They don't plant or gather crops. They don't put away crops in storerooms. But your Father who is in heaven feeds them. Aren't you worth much more than they are? Can you add even one hour to your life by worrying?

And why do you worry about clothes? See how the wild flowers grow. They don't work or make clothing. But here is what I tell you. Not even Solomon in all his royal robes was dressed like one of these flowers. If that is how God dresses the wild grass, won't he dress you even better? Your faith is so small! After all, the grass is here only today. Tomorrow it is thrown into the fire. So don't worry. Don't say, 'What will we eat?' Or, 'What will we drink?' Or, 'What will we wear?' People who are ungodly run after all those things. Your Father who is in heaven knows that you need them. But put God's kingdom first. Do what he wants you to do. Then all those things will also be given to you. So don't worry about tomorrow. Tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own."

Have you ever received advice that seemed a little insensitive or unempathetic?

Jesus' words could easily come across this way if we miss the invitation that He's giving us. Jesus isn't just telling us to stop worrying; he's inviting us to start trusting. And he doesn't expect us to put this trust in just anybody; He invites us to trust our heavenly Father.

Trust really is the centerpiece of every great relationship. Whether it's with a family member,

a friend, or a co-worker, if you want to grow your relationship, you have to grow in trust.

Is it any surprise then that the same would true in our relationship with God. If we really want to have a great relationship with him, we need to learn to trust him. And here's the best part; where people tend to let us down from time to time (even trustworthy people), God will never let you down. He's always there, always loving you, and always in control.

In this passage, Jesus mentions clothing, food, and drink, saying that we can trust God for them. He points out that animals don't worry, so why should we? In other words, God is the God of everything, so we can trust him with everything.

We tend to worry more when we forget this, don't we? We know how life throws curve balls at us, and so we tend to try and manage it all ourselves. And while we do need to work and be responsible, it's never helpful to begin to worry, is it? And this is the beauty of trusting God. When our trust is in him, we can place our worries in his capable hands.

Take a moment and let God know you're trusting him. If you find it hard to trust God, ask him to help you trust in him more. Finally, ask God to give you the wisdom to know what to do and the courage to do it.
