June of 2019 was quite devastating in the life of Ebenezer United Church of Christ. We in Levasy have always known the Missouri River was close in proximity and that it was powerful. This was demonstrated very well on June 1st when the levees broke and water came rushing into the town of Levasy and ultimately our church building and parsonage. This had never happened before and it still seems as though it is a bad dream. Since that time, our congregation has been working hard to remove everything from the buildings that flood waters did not touch and also to remove damaged items and to tear out sheet rock and flooring that must be disposed.

During this time, we have seen God working in all sorts of ways. We have seen people pull together, push up their sleeves and do the physical work of this flood. We have worked alongside people we didn't know. ## HEALTH FACTS

**Juvenile Diabetes** 

Type 1 diabetes in children is a condition in which the body no longer produces insulin which is needed to control blood sugar. The cause is unknown, but most people with type 1 diabetes has an immune system, which normally fights harmful bacteria and viruses, which decides to fight insulin-producing cells in the pancreas instead. Genetics and environmental factors may play a role in this process. There's currently no know way to prevent this diabetes.

Insulin performs the critical job of moving sugar (glucose) from the bloodstream to the body's cells. Sugar enters the bloodstream when food is digested. Without this control, elevated blood sugars can lead to complications such as coronary artery disease and high blood pressure, nerve damage, especially in the feet and legs, kidney damage, poor vision, and poor skin conditions.

The signs and symptoms of type 1 diabetes in children usually develop quickly, over a period of weeks. These symptoms are:

- Increased thirst and frequent urination. Excess sugar building up in the blood pulls fluid from tissues. Suddenly a child can experience bedwetting.
- Extreme hunger is triggered because the sugar isn't in the muscles and organs. Despite eating more than usual, the muscle tissues and fat stores simply shrink, causing another symptom—weight loss which leads to fatigue.
- Irritability or behavior changes can occur with a sudden decline in school performance.
- Fruity breath odor is caused by ketones substances in the digestive track.
- Vision changes and unable to focus clearly occur because fluid is pulled from the eye lenses.
- Increase of yeast infections in the genital area. Skin wounds may not heal properly.

Juvenile diabetes took the life of Rob and Louise Friedrich's grandson, Josh Friedrich, on October 13, 2019, at the age of 22. I pray that God's love will wrap them in solace and give them peace.
